This puzzle was a tasty tasty jigsaw/wordsearch. 18 strips were given containing various letters. These had to be woven, like a lattice, to provide the names of chocolate bars reading across and down in the grid, hence the title CHOCOLATTICE.

The completed lattice is shown above. Some letters were given in black squares instead of white. To find out what these mean, first go through the grid and remove any letters that are used in chocolate bars.

The chocolate bars are: KitKat, Yorkie, Daim, Twix, Crunchie, Bounty, Galaxy, Mars, Aero, Twirl, Milkybar, Picnic, Lion. These are well known in the UK but not necessarily abroad.

The leftover letters, highlighted above, spell MORSE CODE ROWS. Treating each row as morse code, the rows spell RIPPLE (with a gap in the middle, just so the grid was 9x9 rather than 8x9). **RIPPLE** - what you have done to the strips to create the grid - is another chocolate bar, and the answer to this puzzle.

Note to pedants: Yes, technically a dash should be three times the width of a dot in Morse code (as in the top row), but that would have made the puzzle unwieldy and a bit too large to be a nice puzzle. So there.
